\$144,600 over three years to deliver a culturally appropriate, community-based life skills program for children aged 6 to 10 years in order to influence good decision making and acceptance of good behaviours and skills.

\$15,000 over one year to replace the tracks on the main trail grooming equipment. This will ensure that the cross-country ski trails located in Windy Lake and Onaping Falls will be maintained and enjoyed by all.
